**Associate Degree in Nursing to
Bachelor of Science in Nursing RN-BSN Completion Program**

This guide between Black Hawk College (BHC) and Western Illinois University (WIU) is intended for graduates of the [Associate Degree of Nursing](#) program (ADN), and are licensed registered nurses, and intend to apply to WIU's [RN-BSN Completion Program](#) (BSN-CP). By completing all BSN-CP required general education and nursing support courses, students are also candidates to simultaneously earn an [Associate in Arts \(AA\) degree](#) from BHC.

Students are advised to meet with BHC and WIU advisors about admission requirements and academic planning, and to consult the catalogs of both institutions.

Degree Availability The BHC ADN Nursing courses are available at the Quad Cities campus with clinicals scheduled in off-campus health facilities. General education courses and WIU's nursing support courses are available at the BHC Quad Cities or East Campuses or online.

The WIU BSN-CP is available 100% online.

GPA Requirements Graduation from BHC 2.00

Admission to WIU RN-CP is competitive and students are encouraged to exceed the minimum 2.33 GPA required for admission. Completion of all general education and nursing support courses does not guarantee admission to the BSN-CP. After acceptance into the BSN-CP, students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.00 for coursework in the nursing major to remain in the program.

Grade Requirements The BSN-CP requires C+ or better in all general education and nursing support courses. One nursing support course may be repeated one time if the original grade was below a C+. *BHC does not award grades with pluses or minuses; therefore, grades of 'C' or better meet the minimum grade requirement.*

Credit Hours **BHC credits on this guide: 60. WIU credits on this guide: 35.**

- ✓ ADN graduates are eligible to receive up to 30 Advanced Placement Credits from WIU. See <http://www.wiu.edu/catalog/programs/nursing.php> for all requirements.
- ✓ A minimum of 125 credits is required to complete the BSN-CP. (General Education (31), Nursing Support (29), WIU Nursing & Elective (35) and ADN Advanced Placement (up to 30).
- ✓ This guide assumes students have met all course prerequisites.

Other Requirements and Recommendations

- ✓ For BHC
 - Students who earn the AA degree will satisfy WIU’s University General Education Curriculum and WIU’s Multicultural Studies and Human-Well Being requirements will be waived. The BSN-CP credit hour requirement is not waived, and the student must complete the 125 semester hours required for the degree.

- ✓ For WIU
 - The WIU Nursing Department does not require formal entrance testing as this time (i.e. TEAS, HESI).
 - Students are encouraged to view the [WIU Transfer Facts](#) for additional transfer information.

BHC Notes:

- * Indicates a BHC ADN required course. For the ADN, students select PHIL 100 or MATH 108; the BSN-CP requires Philosophy and Statistics.
- If earning the AA degree, include a Non-Western Studies designated course to satisfy either an IAI Humanities, IAI Fine Arts or IAI Social Behavioral Science; a separate “Multicultural Elective” is then not required. For the AA, also complete an IAI Life Science (BIOL 100 or BIOL 101 recommended).
