Informational transfer events

At Transfer Tuesday and Transfer Wednesdays events, admission representatives from four-year colleges visit Black Hawk College Quad-Cities Campus and meet with BHC students.

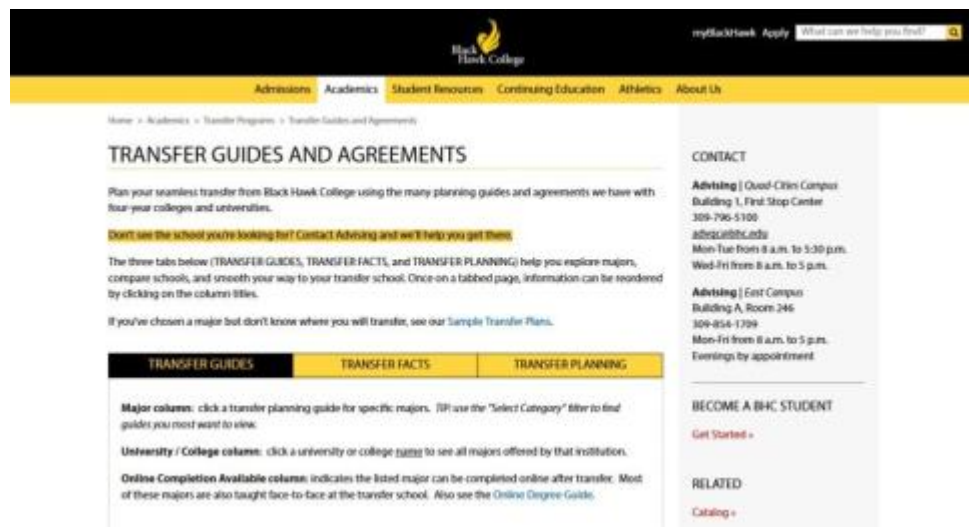

[You can learn more about majors and transfer schools by checking out the BHC Transfer Guides and Agreements web page.](#)

Through the **Transfer Guides** tab, you can sort information by major, university/college name and whether or not online completion is possible. There is also a handy "Select Category" filter on the page to find guides you most want to view. Note you are not limited to these specific schools. The colleges shown are the ones Black Hawk College has transfer planning guides in place with, but BHC advisors can help you transfer to many other schools.

The **Transfer Facts** tab allows you to easily get to a school's transfer admissions website through the University/College column. The Transfer Facts column offers PDFs containing admission criteria and application deadlines, foreign language requirements, scholarships and more that BHC advisors have compiled.



The **Transfer Planning** tab allows you to explore general education requirements for colleges and other useful information. In addition to that, there are great links at the bottom to help you make decisions. You can find institutions and majors throughout Illinois and nationwide, research careers and where to study.

If you're not sure what to major in yet, that is OK, too. Information on majors you could pursue is just a click away.
