SGA Senator Johanna Lopez, of East Moline, pursued SGA to get involved, meet new people, and contribute to her community.

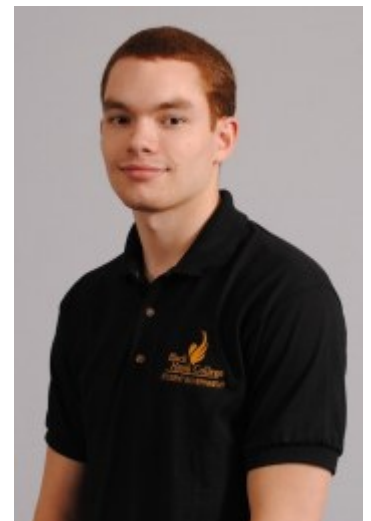
She is a sophomore earning her Associate in Arts. She plans to transfer to Illinois State University to study fashion merchandising.
