Eleven students recently earned the inaugural Surgical Technology Associate in Applied Science degree. Surgical technologists are in demand - nine of the students had jobs lined up before they graduated May 16.

The two-year program launched in August 2017. During their two years of study, the students completed 120 cases in general surgery and four specialties through clinicals at local medical centers.
