Lastly, we need to grow all programs to maximize the use of online technology and to enhance our vocational offerings.

I'm employed as a program manager for the U.S. Department of the Army. I also enjoy serving in other organizations in a volunteer capacity. Typically, my volunteering aligns with my passions and actualizes into a rewarding experience.
