Transfer planning appointments for current BHC students are available that morning. Call advising at 309-796-5100 or email <u>ADVQC@bhc.edu</u> to make an appointment. Advisors recommend that students making appointments have 24 or more college credits completed at the end of this term.

Then, lunch will be served for students curious about transferring to Augie, SAU and WIU during a Gab and Grub event. You can visit with representatives and BHC alumni from these schools and enjoy lunch from 11:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. in the upper lobby of Building 1.

Following that, a Transfer Panel will run from 2:30-3:30 p.m. in Building 1, Room 302. This will feature representatives from Augie, SAU and WIU and BHC alumni.
