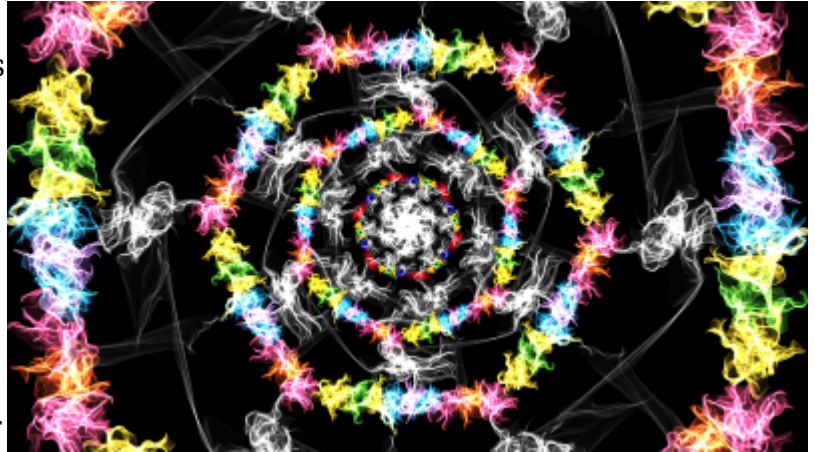


College for Kids went virtual this summer with students and instructors using Canvas (the college's learning management system) to attend classes online.
