What is soil judging?

"Soil judging provides an opportunity for students to study soils through direct experience in the field," according to the American Society of Agronomy Region 5 Soil Judging Handbook.

"Students learn to describe soil properties, identify different kinds of soils and associated landscape features, and interpret soil information for agriculture and other land uses. These skills are developed by studying a variety of soils formed from a wide range of parent materials and vegetation in different topographic settings."
