Train y limm The purpose of this agreement is to formalize the articulation of credit to Black Hawk College (Illinois Community College District 503) (referred to as "BHC") from the Carpenters Apprentice Training Program, governed by the Quad-Cities Builders - Tri-City Carpenters Unions (referred to as "CATP").

Students who complete the full, four year carpenter's apprenticeship training program from CATP will be eligible to articulate their work to BHC and receive:

36 semester credit hours of equivalent carpenter apprenticeship (CA) 1. courses from BHC. These credits will be distributed among twelve, three credit hour CA courses as follows:

 $1^{\rm st}$ year CATP classes (162.5 hrs.) equate as CA 101, 102, and 103 2nd year CATP classes (165 hrs.) equate as CA 104, 105, and 106 3rd year CATP classes (165 hrs.) equate as CA 201, 202, and 203 4th year CATP classes (200 hrs.) equate as CA 204, 205, and 206.

8 semester credit hours in CA 299, Carpenter Internship, for their 2. 1280 hours of "on the job" time as tracked and documented by the student's Union.

Thus, by successfully completing the full carpenter's apprenticeship training program and the necessary contact hours required for the internship, a student can articulate a total of 44 semester credit hours into the Carpenter Apprenticeship AAS degree at BHC.

To receive these articulated credits a student must apply for them through the BHC Registrar. The student applying for the credit must be a previously or currently enrolled student in good standing with BHC. The Registrar will require a copy of the certificate of completion of the student's apprenticeship training from CATP. This certificate must indicate the student's name and date of CATP completion, be accompanied by a letter signed by an official of the CATP, and be mailed by CATP to the Office of the Registrar on behalf of the student. The request to obtain articulated credit must be made within 18 months of the student's completion date as noted on the certificate of completion. If needed for some reason to facilitate the articulation process, BHC may request from CATP, the Union documented reports or tracking of a particular student as further proof of program completion.

The articulated credits will be recorded by the BHC Registrar on the student's transcript as proficiency credit in the 13 CA courses mentioned This recording will take place within 30 days of the first academic term following the student's application for articulated credit.

Students wishing to graduate from BHC in the Carpenter Apprenticeship Degree will need to complete all of the requirements for an AAS degree. This includes the specified 17 semester hours of general education course work. For this degree, the general education component consists of the five courses: CS 100, COMM 100, MATH 103, SOC 100, and SPEC 114. Ideally a student would complete these courses concurrently with the four years at CATP, but they may be completed at any time according to the student's schedule.

Students of CATP who wish to pursue the AAS Degree in Carpenter Apprenticeship will need to complete the standard BHC application for admission form prior to enrolling into their first course at BHC. After that they will follow the normal enrollment, payment, financial aid, and graduation procedures and deadlines. These are published in the schedule of classes.

BHC maintains an open door admission policy that provides access to higher education for those individuals who can benefit from its programs and courses. Furthermore, BHC does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, handicap or age in the recruitment and admission of students, the recruitment and employment of faculty and staff, or the operation of its educational programs as specified by federal laws and regulations.

A Carpenter's Apprenticeship AAS Degree program is being developed at Black Hawk College in response to discussion and planning with the Quad Cities Builders Tri-City Carpenters Union. This program will allow those who successfully complete the 4 year carpenters apprenticeship training offered by the Union to apply that work towards the earning of an Associates degree from Black Hawk College. In addition to successfully completing the Union apprenticeship training, those wishing to earn the Associates degree are required to complete a group of courses at Black Hawk College (or their equivalent) and meet the following requirements.

- 1. be a registered student at Black Hawk College (I.e. go through admissions process)
- 2. complete standard graduation procedures (including filing an "Intent to Graduate" form)
