

Financial Aid Office Citizenship (0CITZ)

The citizenship status you reported on your FAFSA has not been confirmed by the Department of Homeland Security.

If you are a U.S. citizen:

- Please check your FAFSA to verify your name, Social Security number*, and date of birth are correct. If necessary, make corrections and resubmit your FAFSA.
- If the information on your FAFSA is correct, please bring <u>original documentation</u> of your U.S. citizenship to our office <u>in person</u>. Documentation may include:
 - ✓ U.S. Birth Certificate
 - ✓ U.S. Passport
 - ✓ Certificate of Naturalization
 - ✓ Certificate of Citizenship

If you are an eligible noncitizen:

- Please check your FAFSA to verify your name and alien registration number have been entered correctly. If necessary, make corrections and resubmit your FAFSA.
- If the information on your FAFSA is correct, please bring original documentation of your eligible noncitizen status to our office. Documentation may include:
 - ✓ Permanent Resident Card (form I-551)
 - ✓ Machine Readable Immigrant Visa (temporary I-551)
 - ✓ Arrival/ Departure Record (form 1-94)

Please note:

- If you are unable to bring original documentation in person to the Financial Aid Office, please contact our office for further instructions.
- Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) recipients are not eligible for federal financial aid. DACA recipients residing in Illinois may qualify for limited state financial aid to apply, complete the *Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid* at <u>studentportal.isac.org/alternativeapp</u>.
- Students whose documentation expires during the school year, or who are a conditional permanent resident, a refugee, a Cuban-Haitian entrant, a person granted asylum, or a person with temporary documentation must present current documentation in future school years.
