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TRANSFER FACTS

- The OTD program is a 3-year post-baccalaureate program that combines coursework with fieldwork and internships. The
 program accepts up to 36 students annually. It is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy
 Education (ACOTE) of the American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA). Visit the OTD home page and OTD Fact

- All students admitted into the program must have their baccalaureate degree completed by June 1, before their intended start in the OTD program in August. Students may select their baccalaureate degree of choice. The most popular majors are Psychology, Sociology, Biology, Human Performance and Fitness, Exercise Science, and Sport Management. Other majors that pair well with Occupational Therapy are Music or Art.
- All pre-requisite grades must be available by the December 1application deadline (or September 15 if requesting
 consideration for an early admission decision). Applications are submitted online using the Occupational Therapy
 Centralized Application Service (OTCAS) at www.otcas.org.
- Applicants to the OTD program must have a prerequisite course grade point average of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) or higher at the time of application and upon enrollment in the professional program.
- Supplemental materials include documentation of 20 hours of observation with an occupational therapist in at least two different sites (e.g., pediatrics and inpatient rehabilitation). Hours must be completed under an OTR (not a COTA).

Students who wish to complete an associate degree should follow BHC's <u>Associate in Science (AS) or Associate in Arts (AA) degree</u> (60 credits minimum). Students who plan to transfer to SAU prior to completing an associate or bachelor degree should reference the <u>SAU general education requirements</u>. Consult with BHC and SAU advisors for course selection.
