Nursing, B.S.N. (pre-licensure)



Associate in Arts to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (pre-licensure)

This guide between Black Hawk College (BHC) and St. Ambrose University (SAU) intends to create a smooth and seamless curriculum transition for students who earn the Associate in Arts (AA) degree at BHC to transfer into the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree at SAU. **This guide is for students who have not acquired an R.N. license (pre-licensure) and intend to apply for acceptance to the SAU BSN program.** Upon bachelor degree completion, the pre-licensure graduate is eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). This guide incorporates the [Articulation Agreement between BHC and SAU](#) dated December 13, 2013, and the 2021-2022 BHC and SAU catalogs.

Degree Availability	<p>AA offered on campus or online (except French, Spanish and some science labs on campus only.)</p> <p>BS in Nursing offered on campus. The nursing clinical experiences are offered outside the SAU campus in real health care environments.</p>
GPA Requirements	<p>Graduation from BHC 2.00</p> <p>Admission to SAU 2.00. Admission to SAU Nursing major 3.00. Students with a GPA lower than 3.00 may submit a letter of petition to the SAU Admission and Progression Committee explaining the circumstances related to the GPA.</p>
SAU and BSN Applications	<p>View complete admission requirements, applications and FAQ's, including</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Complete an admissions application to SAU <u>and</u> complete a separate admissions application to the Department of Nursing. For fall admission, the priority deadline is December 1 of the previous year, and for spring admission the priority deadline is July 1 of the previous year.2. Complete nine required prerequisite courses with a "C" grade or higher (courses are identified in the BHC course list with an asterisk *).3. Complete general education requirements.4. When a student's primary language is not English, the student must meet the required TOEFL - Proficiency set by the Iowa Board of Nursing.5. CNA (certified nursing assistant) course required plus active certification, or comparable employment within the last three years. Students may enroll in NA 100 (8 credits) at Black Hawk.6. Complete the American Heart Association BLS Provider CPR course. The course is available at Black Hawk.7. Upon acceptance, initiate certified background check process.8. The SAU Nursing Department does not require any formal entrance testing at this time (i.e. TEAS, HESI).

Grade Requirements	SAU will grant transfer credit for college-level work in all areas that correspond to courses offered at SAU if a grade of a “C” or better is earned.
General Education	The AA degree satisfies SAU’s lower division general education requirements except for the Health and Fitness, and Second Language categories (both of which are included in this transfer guide).
Credit Hours	<p><u>BHC credits on this guide: 61. SAU credits on this guide: 67.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ A minimum of 60 credits is required to complete the AA degree. ✓ A minimum of 126 combined credits from BHC and SAU are required to complete the BS in Nursing degree. ✓ A maximum of 64 community college credits may be applied toward the BSN. ✓ While SAU does not award equivalent credit for a certified nursing assistant course, NA 100 could be awarded general elective credit within a maximum of 64 transferrable credits.

Other Requirements and Recommendations

- ✓ BHC requires **one non-western studies course** for graduation and it may simultaneously fulfill an IAI category in Humanities, Fine Arts, or Social and Behavioral Sciences, or be taken as an elective in the AA degree. Social and Behavioral Science courses must be from two different disciplines. Consult the BHC catalog or an advisor for course options.
- ✓ If BIOL 100/101, CHEM 110 and MATH 108 are not completed before transfer, also take MATH 118 Precalculus (5 credits) which meets the pre-requisite requirement for these courses at SAU.
- ✓ SAU requires **a second language** to graduate. Fulfill by completing either three years of the same second language in high school, or the same second language in college (or demonstrated proficiency) through the 102-level. SAU recommends completing this requirement prior to transfer. *Students who already meet the second language requirement while in high school may choose electives to fulfill credits required for graduation. Recommended BHC courses: BIOL 120 (3 credits); BIOL 250 (3 credits); a computer science course such as CS 100, CS 105, CIP 101, BE 146 (3 credits); or MATH 112 (4 credits) and/or MATH 116 (3 credits) if needed as prerequisites to MATH 118. Students may also consider starting an optional minor before transferring.*
