TRANSFER FACTS

- The DPT is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE) of the American Physical Therapy Association. The DPT is a 2.5 year program. Visit the DPT home page and DPt Fact Sheet here for complete admission, application, and program requirements
- St. Ambrose University admits up to 36 qualified students into the DPT program each fall; however, up to fifteen of these spots are filled by students given a conditional admittance to the DPT program as high school seniors meeting TRACK I requirements. A new class begins each fall.
- All prerequisites must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Any major is acceptable; however, the preprofessional course prerequisites must be completed. Common <u>undergraduate majors</u> among DPT students at SAU are Exercise Science, Human Performance and Fitness, Sport Management, Psychology, and Biology.
- TRACK II entry to the Doctor of Physical Therapy Program allows undergraduates from both St. Ambrose and
 other institutions to apply their junior year for consideration of entry into the DPT class that begins during their
 senior year at SAU. Students on this track are able to complete program requirements on a 3+2.5 years plan
 of study.
- TRACK III entry is the more traditional application process for those who are in their senior year of college or hold a bachelor's degree, or a graduate degree from an accredited four-year college or university. Students on this track complete requirements on a 4+2.5 years plan of study.
- TRACKS II and III DPT program admission also requires: a minimum 3.0/4.0 cumulative and prerequisite GPA in all undergraduate coursework or a minimum cumulative graduate GPA of 3.25/4.0 for 18 or more semester hours in an approved graduate science program; 50 hours of documented observation with licensed physical therapists in two or more physical therapy settings including inpatient and outpatient; complete the Graduate Record Exam (GRE); official transcripts from all colleges or universities attended; two references from individuals well acquainted with the applicant; and an on-site personal interview with PT faculty members.

Please note that due to the competitiveness of the program, not all applicants will be invited for an interview.

• TRACKS II and III applications to the program are submitted online through the Physical Therapist Centralized Application Service (PTCAS) at www.ptcas.org. The application deadline is December 1.

All the BHC courses above have prerequisites. Pre-requisites are satisfied through a combination of high school course work, college course work, and/or assessment testing (transcripts and assessment scores are required for documentation). Students who wish to complete an associate degree should follow BHC's <u>Associate in Science (AS) degree</u> (60 credits minimum). Students who plan to transfer to SAU prior to completing an associate or bachelor degree should reference the <u>SAU general education requirements</u>. Consult with BHC and SAU advisors for course selection.
