

- 3 hours of Multicultural Studies
- 3 hours of Human Well-Being

Which Associate Degree Should I Choose?

Associate of Art — Completion of this degree will satisfy WIU General Education requirements. This degree is designed to transfer and parallel the first two years of a bachelor's degree.

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Associate of Science – Completion of this degree will satisfy some WIU General Education requirements but does not guarantee all requirements will be met. This degree is designed to transfer into math & science-related majors.

Associate of Applied Science — Completion of this degree will not meet WIU General Education requirements. This degree is designed for direct employment, and is not designed to transfer.
