



Black Hawk College is a public, comprehensive community college that was organized in 1946 to provide education and training services for individuals in Rock Island and Henry counties and portions of Bureau, Henderson, Knox, Marshall, Mercer, Stark and Whiteside counties in District 503 in northwest Illinois.

District 503 encompasses approximately 2,200 square miles and serves approximately 225,000 residents. The college operates campuses in Moline and Galva as well as the Adult Learning Center in Rock Island, the Community Education Center in Kewanee, the Industrial Training Lab Extension Center in Moline, the Outreach Center in East Moline, and the Welding and Skilled Trades Center in Kewanee. Enrollment is approximately 8,100 credit students.

The mission of Black Hawk College is to provide the environment and resources for individuals to become lifelong learners.

The operating budget for fiscal year 2019 is \$33,448,142. The full budget document may be found on the college website at www.bhc.edu/budget.

The college employs an estimated 288 full-time employees and estimated 237 part-time employees as of February 2018.
