Admission

Acceptance of AA and/or AS degree

SIUE's General Education Program can be met by 1) earning the **Associate in Arts** degree or the Associate in Science degree, or completing the IAI GECC, and 2) completing a course with SIUE's Interdisciplinary Studies designation and the Diversity of Knowledge requirement. In call cases, English 101 and English 102 must be completed with a 'C' grade or better.

Acceptance of Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses

CTE courses are evaluated individually.

Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI)

SIUE is a full participant. The IAI GECC may be completed after transfer if 30 or more hours of transfer credit have been earned.

Credits and Residency

Grades

Grades of "D" do transfer with exception of English 101 and English 102 which must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Some majors require a GPA higher than 2.0 and/or specific coursework with grades of "C" or better.

Second Language

For admission: None

<u>For graduation</u>: A student seeking a Bachelor of Arts degree must establish, either by examination or by approved college courses, proficiency in a foreign language equivalent to having completed one year of college-level work in the language. Requirements for some degrees may require proficiency in a foreign language at a level exceeding that equivalent to one year's college-level study.
