Admission

Acceptance of AA and/or AS degree

The Associate in Arts degree will satisfy the [Bradley Core Curriculum](#).

The Associate in Science degree will satisfy the Bradley Core Curriculum if the IAI GECC is completed within the AS degree.

Re: ENG 102 - The majors of Accounting, Computer Science & Information Systems, or Engineering require the second semester of English composition to be taken at the 300-level. Students who complete all IAI GECC requirements except for ENG 102 (IAI: C1 901R) will complete their Bradley Core Curriculum requirements on successful completion of an approved Bradley W2 course. BHC's ENG 102 transfers to Bradley as elective credit.

Acceptance of Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses

CTE courses are evaluated on a course-by-course basis. Visit BHC's [Course Equivalency](#) page and contact a Bradley advisor to discuss transferability.

Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI)

Bradley is a full participant. A completed IAI GECC will satisfy the Bradley Core Curriculum. The IAI GECC may be completed after transfer if 30 or more hours of transfer credit have been earned.

Credits and Residency

Minimum Credit Hours to Apply as a Transfer Student	24
Maximum transfer credits accepted from community colleges	66
Maximum transfer credits accepted from all schools attended	Contact Bradley
Residency	30 minimum, and 24 of the last 30 semester hours must be earned in residence
Minimum upper division credits (300- and 400-level courses) required to graduate	40

Minimum upper division credits required to be taken with the transfer school	Contact Bradley
Taking BHC courses after transfer	Students should obtain written approval from the appropriate dean. Contact Bradley

Grades

“D” grades are transferable if a 2.0 GPA has been achieved at the institution at which the course was taken. Exceptions include courses required to satisfy major requirements in the College of Business, the College of Engineering, the Department of Teacher Education, the Department of Nursing and the College of Communications and Fine Arts.

Second Language

For admission: None

For graduation: All candidates for the Bachelor of Arts degree must complete three semesters of college-level foreign language study (through the 201-level) or its equivalent. See the [All-University Degree Requirements](#) in the current catalog for other means to meet the requirement.

Additional Pointers

Physical activity courses are not accepted for transfer credit.

BHC prepares Transfer Pointers as a service to students. The information is subject to change by the transfer school. Students should work with their BHC advisor and the transfer school to stay informed. Students are responsible for confirming transfer school requirements and policies.
