Acceptance of AA and/or AS degree

A.A. Satisfies Lower Division General Education Requirements: Yes. Students who complete the Associate in Arts degree prior to transferring will have completed the Essential Liberal Arts & Sciences section of the Columbia Core requirements.

Within the AA's General Education Core Curriculum (GECC), students should attempt to complete 9 credit hours at the 200 level. After transfer, students will also complete 6 credit hours with a Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) designation. These courses must be taken with Columbia.

A.S. Satisfies Lower Division General Education Requirements: Discuss with a CCC advisor. Some majors may better prepare students for transfer by completing the Associate in Science degree due to increased math and science requirements.

Note: Special topics courses, independent study courses, and internships taken as electives in the AA or AS are evaluated on a case-by-cases basis and may not be transferrable.

Acceptance of Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses

CTE course are evaluated on an individual basis. See <u>Course Equivalencies</u> and discuss with a Columbia advisor.

Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI)

Columbia participates in IAI as a receiving institution meaning it accepts a completed IAI GECC, but does not have its own IAI courses. The IAI GECC may be completed after transfer if 30 or more hours of transfer credit have been earned.

Transfer students who complete the GECC package in lieu of the Columbia Core must still complete the following college-wide degree requirements after transfer:

- Columbia Experience 3 (CCCX 300-level): Innovation and Impact (three credits)
- Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI): (six credits)

Credits and Residency

<u>Grades</u>

Transfer courses must be completed with a C grade or better and must be similar or equivalent in content to those offered by Columbia. The acceptance of transfer credit is at the sole discretion of the college.

Students who meet eligibility requirements for the IAI can transfer courses that apply toward the GECC requirements with a grade of D or better, with the exception of Writing and Rhetoric I and II in which a grade of C or better is required.
