Admission

Visit the [Palmer Transfer Admissions](#) website for admission criteria and application process. Requirements include the Bachelor of Science in General Science (BSGS) and the Doctor of Chiropractic (DCP) degrees.

Palmer strongly recommends working with a Palmer admission advisor to review qualifications and progress toward meeting degree pre-requisites. Each prospective student is considered on an individual basis while planning to meet required prerequisites.

Acceptance of AA and/or AS degree

BHC students intending to complete an associate’s degree prior to transfer should follow the Associate in Science degree requirements along with the Pre-Chiropractic transfer planning guide located at <https://www.bhc.edu/academics/transfer-programs/guides-and-agreements/>. Credits accepted for transfer must have been awarded within five years of the date of admission to Palmer.

Acceptance of Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses

Up to 15 credit hours may be granted from coursework in vocational/technical programs (transferable as freshman/sophomore level courses).

Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI)

Palmer does not participate in IAI.

Credits and Residency

Minimum Credit Hours to Apply as a Transfer Student	For the BSGS: 45, to include 24 credits in life and physical sciences with half of the courses having a lab. For the DCP: If non-degreed, 90 credits including 30 at upper division (the 30 may be completed with Palmer or another institution)
Maximum transfer credits accepted from community colleges	60

No grade below a "C" will be accepted.

Accreditation: The Palmer Doctor of Chiropractic program is professionally accredited by the [Council on Chiropractic Education](#) (CCE) and the Palmer campuses by the [Higher Learning Commission](#).

Alternate credit: Up to 20 credit hours of College Level Examination Program (CLEP) credit may be granted (transferable as freshman/sophomore level courses).
