Listed below are the most significant revisions to the MLA documentation style. (**NOTE**: Further examples of citations can be found at <u>https://owl.purdue.edu/owl/purdue_owl.html</u>.)

- URL/DOI [5.84]: DOI (Direct Object Identifier) is preferred over a permalink or URL. If not available, permalinks are preferred to URLs. A DOI/permalink/URL should be included in the citation whenever applicable. In some cases, the http:// portion can be excluded [5.95]. Always include a DOI, if available, but permalinks and URLs are optional elements, follow your instructor's guidelines on whether or not to include these.
- No More Publication Medium [5.112]: Citations should include the medium (such as Print or Web) except in cases of an unusual medium (such as radio or transcript), which is not explicit in the rest of your citation information or when more than one version of a source is accessible on the same landing page (ex: transcript of lyrics from the music video).
- **Date of Access [5.111]**: Access dates should generally be used for online works without a publication date or if you suspect that the work had been altered or removed.
- One Work Cited in Different Ways [5.104]: When, where, and how you access a work (source) will influence how you cite it. Cite your source based on the version you have. Examples of differing citations for same work: (1) TV show from a DVD, TV broadcast, or through an app (p.329); (2) art viewed in person, online, or in a book (p.332).
- **Descriptive Label Before Page Numbers [5.90]**: Precede a page number or range with the abbreviation pp. (for pages) and single page number with p. (for page).
- Season [5.79]: In citations, if publication date includes a season, the season will be lowercase (ex: spring 2017).
