Admission Criteria: Admissions requirements vary by department. Transfer applicants must have a minimum GPA of 2.5 to be considered for admission. Transfer students having successfully completed 24 or more semester hours at an accredited institution need not supply a copy of their high school transcript unless requested by the Admissions Office. Students having completed fewer than 24 semester hours must submit ACT or SAT scores and a high school transcript.

Application Deadline for Transfer Students: Students are advised to apply as early as one year in advance of attendance, however, applicants may be accepted as late as 30 days prior to the start of the term if space is available. Fall 2017 application deadline is August 1. Application for spring and fall 2018 becomes available July 1. Domestic students apply online at no cost. There is a \$50 application fee for international students. [Apply](#) .

Scholarships: Students who wish to apply for scholarships must have the admission and financial aid application completed by March 1. [Scholarships](#)

- **AA Satisfies Lower Division General Education Requirements:** The Associate in Arts degree will satisfy Bradley's lower division general education requirements. Students will be granted credit for all [Bradley Core Curriculum](#) requirements. It is recommended that students select courses from the Core Curriculum to include in the AA degree. See note below re: ENG 102.
- **AS does not satisfy Lower Division General Education Requirements:** The Associate in Science degree will not satisfy Bradley's lower division general education requirements unless the IAI GECC is completed within the AS degree. It is recommended that students select courses from the [Bradley Core Curriculum](#) to include in the AS degree. See note below re: ENG 102.
- **ENG 102** Students planning to major in Accounting, Computer Science & Information Systems, or Engineering are advised that those programs require the second semester of English composition to be taken at the 300-level. Students who complete all IAI GECC requirements except for ENG 102 (IAI: C1 901R) will be able to complete their Bradley Core Curriculum requirements on successful completion of an approved Bradley W2 course.
- **Foreign Language:** All candidates for the Bachelor of Arts degree must complete three semesters of college-level foreign language study (through the 201 level) or its equivalent. See the [All-University Degree Requirements](#) in the current catalog for details.
- **Grades of "D":** "D" grades are transferable if a 2.0 GPA has been achieved at the institution at which the course was taken. Exceptions include courses required to satisfy major requirements in the College of Business, the College of Engineering, the Department of Teacher Education, the Department of Nursing and the College of Communications and Fine Arts.
- **IAI Participant:** Yes. Prior to transfer, students who complete the IAI GECC should request that their BHC transcript indicate IAI GECC compliance.
- **IAI GECC May be Completed After Transfer:** Yes. Students who have completed 30 semester hours of transfer credit will be allowed to complete the IAI GECC after transfer.

- **Major Selection:** Transfer applicants will be able to select a second choice major on the application for admission. If not selected for admission to their first choice, the applicant will be considered for their second choice.
- **Maximum Community College Hours Accepted in Transfer:** 66. Bradley requires a minimum of 40 semester hours at the 300-level or above, a minimum of 30 semester hours earned in residence, and 24 of the last 30 semester hours earned in residence.
- **Minimum Credit Hours to Apply as a Transfer Student Without High School Transcript and ACT:** 24 semester hours.
