2021-2022 Admission Requirements and

Class Selection

Once admission requirements are met, students with completed college-level coursework are ranked. Students who earn the highest ranking are then selected for admission into the Associate Degree Nursing Program. Ranking is based on GPA of ADN general education courses, Pre-Admission Test scores, required course grades, and any previous degrees obtained.

Process for Admission

- Students need to complete an Associate Degree Nursing program application packet. Applications packets and deadlines are available online at www.bhc.edu/nursing.
- Students must complete the Online Prospective Nursing Student Orientation located at www.bhc.edu/nursingorientation. Myblackhawk login is required to access the orientation.
- Students must take the Nursing entrance exam (HESI) **within one year of application due date**. (see *back page for details*)
Any student not accepted who desires consideration for subsequent nursing classes, must submit an updated application.

Application Dates

Spring Admission – Applications are available in **September** and due the last day of September.

Fall Admission – Applications are available in **February** and due the last day of February.

If the last day of the month falls on a weekend, it is due the Friday before the last day of the month.

Admission into the ADN program is competitive.

Students should apply early in the priority filing period. Not all eligible applicants will be admitted regardless of the date of submission of their application. The student who wishes to enter the Associate Degree Nursing Program must meet requirements based on his or her classification in the following categories

ALL who desire admission must have:

- Completed all prerequisites for required courses with a grade of C or above with the exception of BIOL 145 (requires a B).
- Completed all developmental courses with a grade of C or above
- Completed the Nursing entrance exam (HESI) (*see back page*)
- Earned a high school diploma or the equivalent
- Completed the online Nursing Orientation at www.bhc.edu/nursingorientation.
 - Must apply to Black Hawk at www.bhc.edu/apply and log into MyBlackhawk to access
- Possess physical ability to provide client care*

*Students with chronic health problems or physical disabilities are accepted unless the health problem or disability is such that the student would be unable to complete the objectives of the program. For more information see Technical Abilities Required by the Health Programs in the College Catalog.

College Student Admission:

- 9 college credit hours completed
- 2.7 GPA in required General Education courses for ADN

LPN:

- At this time we are no longer offering a transition course for students who have their LPN.

High School Student Admission:

- Based on High school GPA, class rank, and ACT composite score of at least 20.
- It is highly recommended that students complete chemistry, biology, and as much math as possible when in high school.
- For consideration as a high school student, one must take NURS 112 no later than the first semester immediately upon the one year anniversary of high school graduation.
- 2.7 GPA in required General Education courses for ADN

Advanced Standing Admission (students who have completed clinical nursing courses within 1 (one) year)

- Nursing students who desire transfer or readmission into our Associate Degree Nursing program must complete an application. All transcripts will be evaluated on an individual basis. Placement is determined by faculty reviewing the transcripts and course syllabi. A 2.7 GPA in ADN General Education and Nursing clinical courses is required.
- A reference completed by the Director from the program the student is transferring from must be provided with the application. The reference must be completed on the form provided within the application packet. Additional information for Advance Standing Students can be found with the application packet.

Guidelines for biology and/or nursing courses:

- If anatomy/physiology courses (BIOL 145 and 146) were taken over five years ago from date of acceptance into program, one semester of anatomy/physiology must be repeated to update knowledge. **If a C grade was attained for both courses over 5 years ago, both must be retaken to achieve a B or higher.**
- If microbiology was taken over seven years ago from the date of acceptance into the program the entire course must be retaken.
- Transfer credit for nursing courses taken at another institution will be granted on an individual basis by the nursing faculty. Transfer courses for supporting courses will be granted individually by the appropriate department.
- All nursing courses older than 1(one) year must be repeated.

PREREQUISITE COURSEWORK

Students MUST have prerequisite coursework done or in progress at the time of application to the Associate Degree Nursing Program. (See front page for details on the application process)

- General Education courses must be complete prior to or at the level they are listed.
- For example, PSYC 200 must be completed prior to or while in Level 2 before proceeding to Level 3.

Transcripts from other institutions MUST be submitted OFFICIALLY to ENROLLMENT SERVICES and be evaluated to count towards a degree at Black Hawk College.

Nursing Entrance Exam - HESI -Admission Assessment Examination

Nurse entrance exam must be completed at the time of application or before. It is suggested that students take the nurse entrance exam after they have completed some of the general education courses, especially the introductory sciences.

Benchmark score requirements can be found at www.bhc.edu/nursing. (Score requirements have changed, make sure to refer to the website).

Tests will be available in **July, August, September, December, January, and February** in the Testing Center at the Quad City Campus.

Before the test

Prepare for the test. You can purchase a study guide at the Hawk's Nest Bookstore. The name of the book is "*HESI Admission Assessment Review, 5th Edition.*" A copy is available in the library, but may not be checked out. If you wish to purchase the study guide elsewhere, the ISBN is 978-0-323-58226-1.

On the day of the exam

- Bring the following: photo identification, pen or pencil, \$65 cash (exact change) or check payable to Black Hawk College. Wear a mask.

Where to take the test

BHC Quad City Campus Testing Center - Located below the library at the Quad City Campus (Park in big parking lot off of 70th Street and enter through doors of Building 1. Appointments are needed. Phone number is 309-796-5170. Hours for Computerized Testing Center within the ILC are Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays – 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Thursdays 8:00 a.m. – 7:00 pm and Fridays 8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. You must start the test 4.5 hours before closing time to allow yourself enough time to take the test.

- If you took the test at another school and it was within the past year, we can use those scores. Submit score report with the Associate Degree Nursing Admissions application.
- Complete the acknowledgment of testing form (Pink for ADN program) and give to the testing monitor.
- There is a four function calculator embedded within the test that can be used. If preferred, a four function calculator is allowed during the test.
- A 10-minute break can be taken between content area exam. The exam as a whole is not timed, just the individual content areas. See bottom of page for time allowed per content area. *
- Test scores will be sent to Mrs. Becker. A minimum overall score of 70 is required to be considered for admission. Please contact Mrs. Becker if you have any questions at beckerc@bhc.edu.
- This is a multiple-choice assessment of basic academic knowledge in reading, mathematics, science and English and language usage. The objectives assessed on the HESI exam are those which nurse educators deemed most appropriate and relevant to measure entry level skills and abilities of nursing program applicants.
- **HESI exam must be retaken if taken before July 1, 2020. .**
- **Retests are allowed once per application period cycle, but there must be a 3-week gap between the 1st test and the retake.**
