Things to do:

Step 1: Apply

- Apply for admission at www.bhc.edu/apply.
 - Pay \$20 application fee.
 - Look for your welcome letter in 1-2 business days at the email address you provided on the application.
- Send official transcripts from your high school and/or previous college.
- Send placement scores from another school or ACT/SAT test scores (taken within the last two years).
- Apply for financial aid at www.fafsa.gov. BHC's school code is 001638. FAFSA is now available Oct. 1 for the following fall semester. Get more information at www.bhc.edu/financialaid.

Step 2: Log into myBlackHawk

- Reference the welcome letter for myBlackHawk login instructions.
- Access myBlackHawk through the BHC website or at myblackhawk.bhc.edu.

- Purchase a permit for \$25 at the BHC Police Department at either campus, the Bursar's Office at the Quad-Cities Campus or Enrollment Services at the East Campus. Summers and minimesters are free.
- If you are using financial aid to buy your parking permit, pick up a voucher at the Hawk's Hub or the East Campus Bookstore.
